As a coalition of national nursing organizations, the Nursing Community writes to thank you for introducing the Nursing Workforce Reauthorization Act of 2017 (S. 1109), which will reauthorize the Nursing Workforce Development programs (authorized under Title VIII of the *Public Health Service Act* [42 U.S.C. 296 et. seq]) through fiscal year 2022. The Nursing Community is committed to improving the health of our nation by collaborating to support the education and practice of Registered Nurses and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses. The Nursing Workforce Reauthorization Act of 2017 is a critical investment that modernizes the Title VIII programs so they can continue to develop a workforce that meets the healthcare challenges of tomorrow.

For over fifty years, Title VIII has helped to build the supply and distribution of qualified nurses. These programs bolster nursing education at all levels, increase the number of nurses in the workforce, and provide support to institutions that educate the future nurses to ensure the high demand for nursing care is met. Nurses supported through these programs go on to provide high-quality, evidence-based care to patients in a variety of settings, with a focus on those living in rural and medically underserved communities.

We commend the introduction of the Title VIII Nursing Workforce Reauthorization Act of 2017 as it advances the sustainability of America's health by ensuring the programs have a current federal authorization necessary for funding in future fiscal years.
