EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Nursing Community Coalition (NCC) consists of 63 national nursing organizations committed to improving the health and health care of our nation by collaborating to support Registered Nurses and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses. As of 2019, the NCC elected to change the reporting process of the yearly report from a calendar year overview to a fiscal year (July 1 - June 30) summary. The following report outlines the NCC's engagement, accomplishments, and progress over the past fiscal year.



NCC MEMBERSHIP

The NCC has grown to 63 members, and well represents the cross section of education, practice, research, and regulation within the nursing profession. Together, the NCC has ushered in the 117th Congress, increased funding for Title VIII Nursing Workforce Development programs and National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR), included \$200 million in supplemental funding for the Nurse Corps, and remains united as we continue to confront COVID-19 and other public health and infrastructure needs.



LETTERS & STATEMENTS

With the successful passage of the Title VII Nursing Workforce Reauthorization Act, the NCC had a unique opportunity to speak out on new and current issues. Following our collective core principles, and given the unprecedented events of the past year, the NCC has continued their unified efforts in addressing some of the most pressing issues of the day, including:

- Welcoming the new Administration and 117th Congress;
- Supporting increased funding for Title VIII and NINR;
- Outlining COVID-19 legislative priorities including safety of nursing workforce and additional investments in the nursing profession and research;
- Support for legislation addressing workplace violence, maternal health, recognizing the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps, nursing education, COVID-19 blanket waivers, etc.
